Summary Report: 2023 Fall Survey Immaculate Conception Parish-School Community Submitted by the Parish Pastoral Council of 2023-2024

In the Fall of 2023, the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) invited your participation in a survey about various aspects of our parish-school community life. We thank those who took the time to respond for your responses have helped the PPC discern better the strengths, hopes, and needs of the parishioners we serve. Your answers have already provided (and will continue to provide) the PPC with ideas for goal setting as we move into the future. The PPC wanted to make sure that we reported back to you before the summer break. The following is a summary report of the survey results:

141 people completed in the survey.

- 43% were over 65
- 20% were between the ages of 25 and 44
- 17% were between 45 and 64
- 16% were under 18
- 2% were between 19 and 25

Overall responses to the questions were very positive. 73 to 79% of the respondents answered "Good" to "Very Good" with the following feedback:

- We have a parish-school community where people feel that they are welcomed and that they belong; there is a sense that members of our community care for one another.
- We provide social events that allow parishioners to get to know one another and for families to gather.
- We provide good outreach service to St. Vincent de Paul (i.e., 'soup kitchen' volunteers) and Shepherd's Corner, as well as other areas of outreach, such as home visits, hospital visits, etc.
- We celebrate our liturgies (particularly Holy Eucharist/Mass) well, and offer an opportunity for active participation in our liturgies.
- We make children, youth and young adults feel welcome and included in liturgies (e.g., we have implemented Children's Liturgy of the Word at Sunday Masses)
- We help connect faith to work and family life.
- We support the development of a rich prayer life.

In addition to the questions that required a "Very Good", "Good", "Satisfactory", "Needs Improvement", and "Don't Know" answers, the open-ended questions provided a wide range of opinion about what we can be doing better. Five key themes were identified as needing *more focus* in our parish:

- Children and Youth (e.g., youth group; etc)
- Faith Formation and Enrichment (e.g., bible study; etc)
- Parish Events (e.g., socials; enhancing hospitality and welcome; etc)
- Music Ministry (e.g., more "upbeat" hymns)
- Service & Outreach (e.g., meals brought to the home-bound?; etc)

Many things are possible. However, we also need your support to achieve our goals. We know that our **<u>IC</u>** community (our '<u>i</u>ncredible <u>c</u>ommunity') can do GREAT things by God's grace and through our collective efforts! Therefore, we ask that you consider your own gifts and talents and how you can help us grow in the areas noted above. The **September Sign-up Sundays** will offer us all an opportunity to do our part in enhancing the life of our incredible community!

May God bless our efforts and may the intercession of our Blessed Mother (our patroness, the Immaculate Conception) assist us in our desire to be active and joyful disciples of the Lord!
